6/14/05 **Graham Allison** *Nuclear Terrorism: The Ultimate Preventable Catastrophe*  
Director of the Belfer Center for science and International Affairs at the Kennedy School of Government. Dean of the JFK school from 1977 to 1989. Under President Clinton, served as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Policy and Plans. Subject of his presentation – *Nuclear Terrorism: The Ultimate Preventable Catastrophe*, from his book by the same title.
